15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

To fulfill the directions/requirements of NEP 2020, the institution has implemented multidisciplinary/ interdisciplinary courses both at Graduate as well Postgraduate level. The students study the subjects from at least two faculties as their Major and Minor courses. Thus, since the implementation of NEP 2020, the institution has been striving towards creating an enriching and enabling ecosystem in which students are directed towards multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary education. Subsequently, there is mandatory course one in each semester from Humanities/Social Sciences/Environmental Science/Human Values/Health Science and Computer Science. Aligned with the mandates/directions and objectives chalked out in NEP 2020, all the courses introduced at the Graduate and Postgraduate level are credit-based with the facility of multiple entry and exits.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The State Level Academic Bank of Credits, ABACUS-UP, is a breakthrough initiative introduced by the Uttar Pradesh Government on the lines of the National Academic Depository (NAD). The institution has registered on the aforesaid portal in order to facilitate the enrolled students with multiple entries and exists during their chosen program. Further, the entire evaluation and assessment process is in accordance with Choice Based Credit System. Besides these, faculties are encouraged to revise and enhance their teaching methods and pedagogies. The uploading of the data of the students and faculty on ABACUS portal is under process.

17. Skill development:

In order to promote the upward mobility of students and to bridge the academia-industry gap, our institution has introduced a number of skill development courses in the form of electives and vocational courses. Upholding the vision of NEP-2020 in both letter and spirit, the institution has made various efforts to integrate traditional learning with a focus on skill development. The students have an option to choose between- a.) Computer Office Management , b.) Public Relation officer, c.) Self Employed Tailor, d.) Yoga Instructor, e.) GST, f.) Financial Accounting and Tally, and g.) Digital Marketing etc. Such a wide range of vocational and skill development courses have surely helped in merging scientific temperament with universal values in the students. With the

introduction of Vocational courses like- Proficiency in English Speaking and Business English Communication, ample emphasis has been made on the development of soft skills among students. Moreover, all these courses have been approved by the University.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Keeping in tandem with NEP'20's focus on not merely the preservation but also a widespread use and integration of Indian Knowledge System into mainstream curriculum, the college has been working rigorously to promote the same tenet. As a testament to the institution's steadfast commitment to the promotion and integration of India's rich cultural and linguistic heritage, the faculty members are encouraged to teach in a bilingual mode. Holding the tenets of 'experience, observation, experimentation, and rigorous analysis' the students in college are encouraged to learn and participate in activities which expose them to India's rich and ancient cultural fabric. Department of Hindi celebrates 'Hindi Saptaah' every year with the organization of various literary and artistic activities to make the students aware of their rich linguistic heritage. 19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The objectives laid out regarding Outcome based education in NEP 2020 are- Competency, Standard, Benchmarks, and Attainment of targets. As our institution does not enjoy the freedom of designing the curriculum being an affiliated body of DBRAU, Agra, the emphasis is made on a better implementation of the curriculum. All the programs at both Graduate and Postgraduate level have their clearly specified Course Outcomes. The faculty members are encouraged to incorporate a variety of approaches in teaching-learning process like- classroom lectures, seminars, workshops/practical and projectbased learning. All the courses are designed and disseminated in ways as to nurture and strengthen not only domain specific knowledge among the students but also develop their cognitive, logical, social, and moral competency.

20.Distance education/online education:

Understanding the relevance of online and digital education, the

institution has been continuously making progress in incorporating online education in its teaching-learning infrastructure. Faculty members as well as students are encouraged to blend traditional classroom teaching-learning with online education. Faculty members have been conducting online classes along with classroom lectures to integrate and incorporate digital and online education. Teachers use online platforms like Google Meet, Zoom, WhatsApp, and Google Classroom as part of blended teaching methods. In the session 2023-2024, some departmental activities and competitions were organized using online mode. Some faculty members conducted online classes throughout the session. Further, the faculty members provide study material from various educational platforms and Open Education Resources (OERs) as part of their teaching tools. Such pedagogies in the teaching-learning process have surely helped in providing an enriching and augmented multidisciplinary learning experience to the students.

It only implements the university curriculum in strict accordance with existing rules and norms. The curriculum is designed by Dr B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra. The college always ensures the effective curriculum delivery by preparing its own academic calendar at the beginning of every academic year in accordance with university curriculum and notifications. Academic Planner has been introduced from the session 2022-23 to make the documentation more concrete and transparent. Accordingly, each faculty of the college prepares its own teaching plan, and conduct classes and other academic and co-curricular activities, such as class tests, quizzes, assignments, dissertation, practicals, group discussions, workshops, competitions and guest lecturers etc. According to the timetable and academic calendar, the teaching plan includes topics to be taught, remedial classes, revision, practicals and assessment plan as per the permitted time schedule. Timetable is prepared by timetable committee every academic year. After approval of the principal, it is circulated to all faculty members and displayed on notice board for students. The faculties have all sort of support and freedom to deliver the curriculum in time.

Added to this, students are encouraged to acquire and develop problem-solving skills, to participate in various activities and competitions at intra and inter- college level.

The subject teachers monitor the performance of the students (slow/ advanced learners) and motivate them to perform better. Home assignments, class interactions, class tests, quizzes and paper presentations are used as tools for the continuous evaluation of students. At the institutional level Pre-University examination and Mid-Term Examinations are conducted every academic year as per the Academic Calendar. These examinations are conducted strictly in accordance with the university pattern and procedure maintaining complete transparency and confidentiality. Answer sheets are evaluated and shown to students. This enables the students to assess their preparation before final university examinations and improve accordingly. The parents are also informed about the performance of their wards. University examinations are conducted as per the norms and regulations of Dr B.R. Ambedkar University, Agra. Attainment of programme and course outcomes are completely based on students' previous year academic performance in annual university examination. Attainment level is measured in terms of actual percentage of students getting a required percentage of marks in every paper. The students who scored the minimum passing marks in all subjects are promoted to next level/ class. If a student fails to obtain the minimum passing marks in any one subject, she can appear in the Re-examination organized by the University to achieve passing marks for next level course. The outcomes are thus measured on the basis of individual marks obtained by a student against the maximum marks. As per Dr B.R.A. University norms, students of Undergraduate programmes have to obtain minimum 35 percent marks in each subject. Students of post graduate courses need to obtain at least 36 percent marks for promotion to the next level.

The College is adequately equipped with the following infrastructure and physical facilities to ensure a vibrant and viable teaching-learning environment.

1. Well-furnished and thoroughly ventilated classrooms with proper seating arrangement, whiteboards, lights, and fans.
2. 11 laboratories with adequate stock of necessary equipment.
3. A well-furnished common staff room with proper seating arrangements attached with the washroom, lights, fans, refrigerator and C.C.T.V. camera. The common staff room is also used as the Control Room during all examinations.

4. A rich library exists in the college with a huge collection of textbooks, reference books, C.D., and videos. It has two reading sections one for students and another for faculty. Also, there is an E-library section having C.Ds. videos and 02 computers with internet facility to ensure accessibility of e-material.

5. A conference hall equipped with a projector, LCD, ACs, and Wi- Fi connectivity is also available.

6. The institution also owns 24 computers spread across the Drawing & Painting Department, Administrative Block, Library, Computer Lab, and Language Lab. Besides, the Language Laboratory is also equipped with headphones to facilitate communication skills training, with a focus on English language proficiency. Recently the college has established a commerce Lab equipped with various relevant documents and computers/ tablets.

The college library is partially automated with library management software (LMS) which was installed in the year 2015 and which now needs an upgradation. The Library also has access to UP Digital Library where the students can access the content related to their curriculum. The teachers also have the facility to upload e-content of their subject in the UP Digital Library. The institution also has subscription of 6 newspapers, 7 magazines and few journals. At present there are 6,141 textbooks, 16,435 reference books summing up to about 23000 books and 116 CDs and Videos in the library for students and faculties. New books for library are purchased according to requirements every year. During 2023-24 the total expenditure on library was Rs. 1,51,000. All the important newspapers, journals, and magazines are available in the library to keep the students and faculties well informed about contemporary issues. The wall magazine section in the library enables students to share their innovative constructive thoughts and provides them an opportunity to explore their creativity. The E-library section has CDs and eBooks related to different subjects. The computers in the E-library section facilitate access to information and study materials from online libraries and other websites.
